Discusses how the birth of a child changes everything for both parents. Makes viewers aware of the difficulties a teen mother faces in raising her child, getting an education, and the emotional and financial responsibilities a teen father has to shoulder. Encourages teens to get help for family or school problems and to learn more about contraception. Audience: Grades 9-12, young adults.

It is also the story of Joe Cloutier, the teacher and former dropout who is determined to help them. Marilyn and Lance candidly discuss the abuse and violence that drove them into prostitution and drug dealing. The video also introduces Joe's innovative approach, combining alternative education and popular theatre as a way to get young people off the streets. Witness the remarkable transformation of Lance and Marilyn from 1986 to 1993 as they become leaders at their school.

This video can be used to encourage discussion for youth learning and establishing relationships.

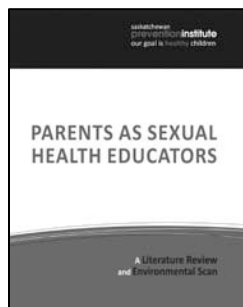

The Advisory Committee on Family Planning Sexual Health Education Survey investigated parental attitudes toward sexual health education in the province of Saskatchewan between October 2006 and February 2007. Survey results provide insight into Saskatchewan parents' ideas about sexual health education, their attitudes and expectations, and their perceptions of their own knowledge and comfort with providing sexual health education to their school-aged children. The findings provide a basis for discussion regarding current school-based sexual health education approaches and whether these approaches are meeting the needs of Saskatchewan families with school-aged children.

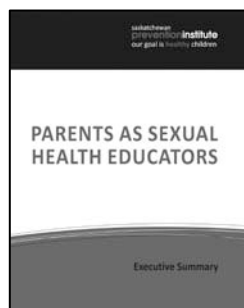
